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I. Introduction.

A. The importance of the individual. (Acts 22:6-10)

B. Important questions: Who are you Lord? What shall I do Lord?

1. There are many voices in the world trying to tell us the way to walk. The voice we ought to listen to is the Lord's.

2. Who the Lord is makes a difference as to what one does.

II. Who are you Lord?

A. A lifetime is spent understanding the answer to this question.

B. The Lord is the first thing that will amaze us about heaven.

C. Three pictures of the Lord.

1. He is the Lord of creation. (John 1:3, Colossians 1:16)

2. He is the Lord of salvation by bearing our own sins on his own body on the cross. (Acts 4, 1 Peter 2:24, Luke 2:11)

a. The speaker gave his life to the Lord when he was in doubt about his final destination.

b. It was a simple unemotional request, but it was the beginning of his life change.

c. You too can experience this - Jesus can be Lord of salvation in your heart.

3. He is the Lord of judgment. (John 5:22)

a. There is a time for judgment. (Acts 17:31)

b. Judgment will be done by a man who can sympathize with us. (Hebrews 4)

III. What shall I do Lord?

A. This is the right question because of who was speaking.

B. The vast majority of Scriptures on the will of God has to do simply with doing it over finding it.

C. God is looking for a man after God's own heart. Find out what God wants you to do and do it. (Acts 13:22)

D. God has a specific will for you.

E. Dealing with difficulties.

1. When the troubles become too many, give them to the Lord in prayer one by one.

2. Also, re-surrender yourself unto the Lord, and ask the Lord to prompt you if He wants to use you in any of those situations.

3. The Spirit leads with a gentle tug not a jerk or troubling spirit.
