I. Introduction.

A. Text: Psalm 18:30.

B. Promises the speaker claimed.

1. The speaker received Christ—allowing Him to come in—through the promise of Revelation 3:20.

2. He learned through the founder of the Navigators—Dawson Trotman—that God would supply all of his needs. (Philippians 4:19)

3. God impressed upon the speaker that He would bless his children. (Isaiah 44:3)

C. God wants to give you some promises. (Isaiah 43:4-7)

II. Your sin will be found out. (Numbers 32:23)

A. Sin ends up in death.

B. To set our minds on the Spirit in contrast to the flesh is life. What gets your attention gets you. (Romans 6)

C. Sin will find you out in your personal life.

D. Sin will find you out in your spiritual life. (Isaiah 59)

III. If you confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive you. (1 John 1:9)

A. This is a promise you cannot wear out.

B. It says He is “faithful” and “just” instead of loving and merciful because the blood of Christ keeps cleansing us from all sins. (1 John 1:7)

C. No matter our sin, there is a way out. The good news is for us as Christians our whole life through.

D. The secret of success in the ministry is to keep a conscience void of offense towards God and man—this is an inner freedom of spirit one gets when one knows that he has tried to make all wrongs right. (Acts 24:16)
